#### From the Head Teacher's desk

am delighted that Mr Cassidy will be the new Head Teacher with effect from 7 January and I offer him my warmest congratulations. Mr Cassidy knows St Brigid's children and families well and we are working very closely together to ensure a smooth handover. Mr Cassidy will keep you informed as to the process of recruiting a new Depute Head Teacher.

The improvement work of the school carries on and this month I am sharing with you some of the work we have been doing to raise further children's attainment in literacy and numeracy. Last week all P2—P7 parents had an opportunity to come to school to share learning in literacy with your child and you will have seen in class some of the strategies mentioned over the page. P1 parents had the opportunity to hear about, and see how we teach, phonological awareness at the beginning of the school session.

We are very proud of the children who attended the residential week at Blairvadach Outdoor Centre. The children had a wonderful time experiencing new and exciting activities and they were a credit to home and school. The instructors were full of praise for their enthusiasm and effort and the cleaning staff commented that we were such a tidy group. They said, 'the rooms are spotless' and 'they're welcome back anytime'.

The Feast of St Andrew (30 November) draws to a close the celebrations to mark the centenary of 1918 Education Act which provided public funding for Catholic schools. It has been great to be part of the celebrations and witness the positive messages about Catholic schools that have been communicated both locally and nationally. Along with two Pupil Councillors, I attended a Civic Reception hosted by the Lord Provost and I was honoured to be invited to a national celebration hosted by the Scottish Government in Edinburgh Castle.

It seems very strange that after so many years this will be the last newsletter I will write. It has been a privilege to have been the head teacher of St Brigid's Primary and have the pleasure of working with so many wonderful children, talented and hard working staff and supportive parents. #### How Are We Improving Our School?

Priority: to continue to improve attainment in literacy and numeracy.

#### What have we done to achieve this in literacy?

- We now have a stronger focus on teaching pho- $\sqrt{}$ nological awareness at the early stages.
- We have ensured a consistent approach to teaching reading strategies across the school.
- We have introduced a similar approach to teaching writing strategies across the school.
- Teachers have visited colleagues' classrooms and moderated samples of children's writing within school, and at P1, P4 and P7 also with partner schools, to ensure shared and consistent standards.

#### What have we done to achieve this in numeracy?

- We have continued to encourage children to use concrete materials and/or draw out a problem before moving to a written calculation, and supported this by purchasing additional practical number materials.
- We are continuing to develop children's ability to solve words problems at different levels of challenge e.g. mild, hot, spicy, extra spicy.

#### Strategies across the curriculum:

- λ We have amended the way in which children are involved in describing their learning and identifying their next steps.
- We have looked at standardised assessment information in depth and identified curriculum aspects which could be enhanced.

#### What will we do next?

We will review our assessment policy to ensure which assessments are most appropriate, when they will be used and how the information gained will be used.
