School Improvement Plan Priority 4: to celebrate the catholicity of the school and evaluate and plan for the Catholic faith development of our school community, particularly in relation to serving the common good.

How we are achieving this target:

- ◆ All children will have had learning opportunities to understand the historical and present contexts of Catholic schools, including the Church's teaching about our responsibility for the poor and vulnerable.

- ◆ Senior children and staff will join with the national Catholic education community at the national schools' Mass in Falkirk.
