### News from the Head Teachers' desk

It is always a pleasure to begin our newsletter sharing the successes of our children with you. Once again, the choir enhanced the reputation of our school when they led the singing at Archbishop Philip's Mass for Primary 7 children in St Andrew's Cathedral. In only their second year working with Mr Woods, our football team is through to the final of the Opfer Logan Cup; and our netball team won silver medals in a recent tournament for Glasgow South schools.

We have been fortunate to secure additional funding to enhance the children's experiences. Mrs Moretti successfully applied for an Awards for All grant for £9188. We hope to add to this amount to build an outdoor classroom. We have also been awarded a Glasgow City Council area grant to purchase track suits, which will make our sports' teams look super smart when they take part in competitions. A further grant has been applied for to subsidise the cost of next session's P7 residential trip.

During May, a number of our children and staff gathered to say the Rosary before school each morning. It was lovely to begin the day in such a prayerful way. Twelve of our P4 children will receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion on Saturday 4 June. Please remember them and their families in your prayers.

Thank you to our hard-working Parent Council and all who supported them to make Saturday's fête such a success.

Families may be entitled to receive a school clothing grant of £47 per child. Forms are available on line or from the school office. In addition to the monetary grant, the number of children receiving clothing grants affects our staffing entitlement. We have not been allocated additional staffing for next year so please consider applying for the grant, if you are eligible, even if your child is in P1—P3 and automatically entitled to a free meal.

We will have a number of staff changes next session. Mrs Doreen Burns will be retiring at the end of term. On behalf of our whole school community, I should like to thank Mrs Burns for all she has done for the children and to wish her a long, happy and healthy retirement. Ms Jones will be returning to St Brigid's next session and Mr Stuart Walker has been appointed as a permanent teacher in St Brigid's. Mrs Walsh will be going on maternity leave at the end of August and two new teachers will be appointed on a temporary basis. We hope that most children will be able to spend the afternoon of Tuesday 21 June with their teacher for next session.

### **High Expectations -School Uniform**

As parents may be thinking of refreshing items for the start of the new school session, a reminder of our school uniform may be helpful. Our uniform has been standardised to include: a plain pale blue school shirt (not a fashion variation); school tie; grey skirt or grey tailored school trousers and a plain grey v-neck pullo-



ver or cardigan. A plain pale blue polo shirt and simple dark blue shorts are ideal for PE. Socks or tights should be plain grey with no embellishment. We would also ask that children have black school shoes and simple **black gym shoes** for PE and to change into in school. **School ties** are available to buy from the school while other items of school uniform are readily available at reasonable cost in local supermarkets and high street stores. Hair accessories should be simple in navy and/ or yellow-sparkly accessories are not suitable for school. We know that children can try to persuade parents to purchase more fashionable items and brands with logos, often telling you that is what their friends have, so we would ask that home and school work together to ensure a consistent approach to uniform. We want our children to be proud of their school, have a strong sense of belonging to our community and look as smart as children from any other school in the city. Thank you in anticipation of your support when you purchase items of uniform for your child.
