Improving Our School

School Improvement Plan Priority 1b: To raise attainment and achievement in numeracy.



How are we working to achieve this?

- Children at all stages are being given regular opportunities to develop a deeper understanding of number concepts through using concrete materials and picture representations before progressing to written calculations.
- Children at all stages are having regular opportunities to work on maths problems with different levels of challenge and to discuss their numeracy and maths learning with a partner.
- ♦ Teachers will use the national benchmarks and the new national assessments to support their judgements of children's progress in numeracy.
- All children are having regular supported opportunities to consider the purpose of their learning, link their learning to skills for learning, life and work and to identify their next steps.
- Teachers and senior staff will engage in professional learning with colleagues, including shared classroom visits.



Skills for Learning, Life and Work 13 –17 November

During the week beginning 13 November we will have a special focus on financial education and the world of work. All classes will be learning about aspects of money. P6 and P7 children will also take part in a World of Work day on 14 November when they will have an opportunity to meet representatives of a range of jobs, employers and training providers. Please talk to the children about the kind of questions they would like answered and, after the event, what they found most interesting.
