

From the Head Teacher's desk

n St Brigid's Primary we are continuing to celebrate and reward good attendance as we know that attendance at school is closely related to how well children achieve. At this week's assembly, 164 children received a certificate for perfect attendance and 89 children for attendance of 95% or better. This means that 84% of the children achieved Glasgow's target of 95% attendance or better. Thank you for supporting your children's learning in this way.

Everyone in St Brigid's Primary is continuing to work hard to improve the education provided for the children. In this month's newsletter, you will find more information on how we are promoting the distinct Catholic mission of our school, including as part of the national celebrations around the centenary of the education act which brought Catholic schools into local authority governance, thereby, providing the same funding as enjoyed by non-denominational schools. On Friday 23 November, two P7 pupils and I will be attending a Glasgow City Council civic reception for those involved in Catholic education. Next month I will give you more information on our progress with raising attainment in core subjects.

The recent danceathon was a huge success. The children had a fun day while raising money to help those less fortunate. £2300 was raised and the Minni Vinnies group who organised the event will decide how to allocate the money. Thank you so much for your generosity.

Final preparations are being made for the residential trip to Blairvadach with the children becoming increasingly excited as the day draws near. Primary 1 Enrolment for August

Children who will be age 5 by 29 February 2020 are due to start school in August 2019. Glasgow City Council has changed the enrolment procedure to an online application form for parents/carers to register their children at the local catchment school.

Enrolment week will be week commencing Monday 5 November 2018.

If you are unable to access the internet, paper applications will only be available on request from Olympia Hub at Tel: 0141 287 8000. ALL paper forms MUST be sent to the hub for action, we are unable to accept these in school.

Parents who wish to defer their child's entry date to school should still register online.



Parents and carers of new P1 children are invited to bring the children to story time in our school library on **Thursday 6 December at 1:30pm.** This is a great opportunity for the children to have their first introduction to school and for parents and carers to ask any questions.
