We have also received our third Lord Provosts' Award for Road Safety. This award is in recognition of the work done across the school to help the children keep themselves safe on the roads. We are always working to improve the education we provide for the children and each year prepare a school improvement plan which is the focus of our work for that year. We will continue to encourage excellent attendance as we know there is a strong link between attendance and children's attainment and achievement. Attendance awards for the first term will be given out at assembly on 30 October.

Improving Our School

School Improvement Plan Priority 1: To raise attainment and achievement in literacy.

We are working towards achieving this by:

- Adapting the primary 1 curriculum to ensure a strong foundation in phonological awareness before progressing to the formal teaching of phonics.
- Giving Primary 1 parents the opportunity to hear about phonological awareness, why it is the building block for reading and how they can help at home. Primary 1 parents have also had the opportunity to share their children's learning in class.
- Extending children's vocabulary. In P1–P3 classes this includes reading and discussing three stories per day.
- Using advice from Glasgow's Literacy for All programme to review how we teach understanding of what is read.
- Refreshing how we teach writing using *Big Writing*. All teachers will attend in-service on using this method in October.
- Using the new national benchmarks for talking and listening, reading and writing to assess children's progress
- Helping children to understand the purpose of their learning, how it links to skills for learning, life and work and identify their next steps.

Catholic Schools—Good for Scotland Celebrating 100 years of partnership

In 2018 we will reach the centenary of the 1918 Education (Scotland) Act. This was the Act that saw Catholic schools transfer from Diocesan control to State governance. It is a chance to publicly mark the ways in which Catholic schools are not just good for Catholics, but good for Scotland. This is a time to reflect and thank God for one hundred years of serving our local communities. An Icon of Jesus the teacher has been commissioned to mark the centenary of the Education Act. The icon will tour the country from Catholic Education week at the end of January, visiting each diocese for 4-6 weeks. The icon is due to visit the Archdiocese of Glasgow in September/October 2018.

The anniversary of the Act links very well to 60th anniversary of the opening of St Brigid's Primary on 29th April 1958 as a Catholic school for the community of Toryglen. During this school year and next, the children will be involved in learning activities and celebrations around both anniversaries. I am particularly delighted that Archbishop Tartaglia has agreed to celebrate our anniversary Mass on Friday 27th April in St Brigid's Church. We would love to know if any of the current children are the third or fourth generations of a family to attend St Brigid's.

Also, as part of our 60th anniversary celebrations we intend to have a whole school photograph taken on Thursday 12 October. Individual photographs of each child will also be available for purchase. Ideally, we would like every child to be in full school uniform with pale blue shirts and school ties on that day.



Raising Attainment in

Numeracy and Maths

How you can help?

All children in St Brigid's now have an active Sumdog account. Sumdog can be accessed through a PC or tablet (via Sumdog app). We would encourage children to use Sumdog at home as part of their weekly Maths homework.

Sumdog is an educational website that motivates students to practise mathematics skills through online games. Sumdog has been developed with the help of teachers and educational experts around the world. Researchers have found that the length of time spent using Sumdog has a highly significant, positive impact on pupils' mathematical improvement. Pupils who spend an average of 1 hour per week on Sumdog, have been found to progress 3 times faster in mathematics. Pupils and teachers have observed an improvement in both mathematical ability and attitude towards learning mathematics since beginning regular Sumdog use.



School Sports Loyalty Card

Last year, our School Sport Loyalty Card was introduced for P4-P7 classes. It has recently been relaunched at assembly for all pupils in the school. The aim of this is to encourage greater participation in our school sports clubs. This was a success in its first year with 91.4% of pupils participating in at least one school sports club. Every time a child takes part in a school sports club they will receive a star on their loyalty card and once their loyalty card is complete with 8 stars it gets entered into our sports prize draw. Pupils can enter as many loyalty cards into the draw as possible so the more sports clubs pupils attend the greater the chance of winning a prize. Last year our prizes were a tour of Celtic Park, a tour of Ibrox stadium, tickets for the Glasgow Tigers, tickets for the Sirens netball, vouchers for AirSpace and brand new footballs.
