Health Week-March 2023

Huge thank you to Mr Woods for organising our very successful Health Week. Here are some of the highlights.

The Health Committee met with Mr Woods in the lead up to Health Week to make suggestions about the type of sessions that they felt the children in their class would benefit from.

During Health Week, all children in the school went to a special assembly led by Helen from the Dogs Trust.

Children in Primary 1-2 took part in a multisports session with Stephen Thomson, our Active Schools Coordinator. Children in Primary 7 took part in a similar session with Lewis McTaggart who is the Active Schools Coordinator for Holyrood Secondary. Children in Primary 1-7 took part in a football taster session with coaches from Glasgow Clyde College and Mr Woods.

Mr Cassidy provided all classes in the school with the opportunity to receive a taster session in gymnastics which they all thoroughly enjoyed. Ms Shaw led badminton and basketball sessions to children in all classes in the school; the children loved developing a range of skills during these sessions.

Glasgow City Council's Road Safety team visited all classes in the school providing a range of workshops for children such as Brake Reactor for P6 and P6/5 where children tested their reaction speed and children in P7 used speed guns to measure the average speed of traffic on Prospecthill Rd.

NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde nurses provided Oral Health workshops for all children in the classroom where children learned about the importance of oral hygiene. Also, Elizabeth from Asda supported us with how to make healthy snacks and sandwiches. They provided many of the ingredients too!

Many thanks to all of our partners for their contributions to our Health Week; our children loved the opportunities and can't wait until next year.
