From the Head Teacher's desk

elcome back to all our children and staff. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone in our community for ensuring that our school could reopen in a safe manner. The school has been so calm and I am delighted to report that children are very well settled. I am thrilled with the result of our combined efforts and everyone should be very proud of how smoothly we have opened the school in difficult and challenging circumstances.

In this newsletter, you will be reminded of the information on the practical arrangements which you need to know about as we work to ensure St Brigid's Primary is a safe and purposeful learning environment for our children. Please look out for any new information too. In St Brigid's Primary, we have assessed risk in line with council policy and have put systems and procedures in place which take activities already assessed as low risk and minimise this risk even further. Hand washing is being facilitated throughout the day by teaching and support staff. In addition, staggered breaks will ensure that everyone comes into minimal contact with others who are not in their class.

This session, we also welcome new staff to the school and hope that they quickly feel part of our St Brigid's family. Mr James Brady (P6a teacher), Mrs Zeab Ahmad (English as an Additional Language teacher) and Miss Lucy Anderson (class cover and support teacher).

At the end of the session we said a fond farewell to P7 and we wish them the best of luck as they continue their education in Holyrood Secondary. We also said goodbye to Miss O' Kane and Miss Kennedy who have secured posts in other schools in the city. Mr Keddilty, one of our Principal teachers, has secured a permanent Depute Head Teacher post in St Vincent's Primary following a secondment in St Albert's Primary. Congratulations to them all and we offer them our best wishes for the future and thank them for their contributions during their time in St Brigid's.

Entering the school building/Playground

Can I remind parents and carers that they are **not permitted to come into the playground** and that each child should be accompanied by 1 parent/carer only (there are special circumstances for P1 parents and carers for the first few weeks)? Your child should enter the playground from the allocated gate no earlier than 8:50am and there will be a member of the management team in each playground. Once your child has entered the playground, **we ask that you make your way home in order to minimise the number of parents/carers gathering at the gates.** The gate across the playground will be locked and so is no longer available as a short cut from Newhouse Rd to Glenmore Ave or vice versa. The gate will be opened for a few minutes in the morning and afternoon to allow P5 & P6a access to and from the main entrance.

! Important !

If you wish to speak to a member of staff for any reason, you must phone the school—new national protocols mean that we can no longer have a quick chat in the playground. I am hoping this will not last too long.

If you have children in both playgrounds, please collect your youngest child/ren from the infant yard and then make your way to the Prospecthill Rd gate where you can collect your other child/ren. Older children are no longer allowed to move across the school to the infant yard. Staff will wait with children until you walk round.

Enhanced cleaning provision

A rigorous approach to environmental cleaning is being implemented to prevent the spread of the virus. Our current before and afterschool cleaning regime will be enhanced by a new day cleaner everyday from 10:00am-2:00pm. Our current cleaners have had their hours increased and will cover this post.



All frequently touched surfaces, equipment, door handles and toilets used during the day will be cleaned throughout the day by the day cleaner. Staff also have access to cleaning materials in class if they feel that need to sanitise an area at any point.



Social Distancing

There is no requirement for children to socially distance. Indoors, the children will be maintained in their classes throughout the day wherever possible. Chil dren will, however, mix out with their classes in the playground.

2 metre physical distancing should be maintained at all times between adults and adults as well as adults and children to support a safe environment.

Staff will work with children to ensure that they understand the need to this in a nurturing way.

If there is a requirement for extended first aid then PPE willbe worn by the adult administering the first aid.

High Expectations School Uniform

The children all look very smart in their new uniforms. Please continue to support our full uniform policy as this helps children to feel included and to be proud of their school. I am glad that P1 have had the chance to wear their ties, however from Tuesday 18 August, I would ask that all children do not wear a school tie as it is difficult to wash them as often. This is under constant review and I will write to you after the September weekend with an update. I am hoping to have everyone back in ties as soon as possible.

- School tie or P7 tie (currently not required and changes will be communicated)
- Grey skirt or grey tailored school trousers
- Plain grey v-neck pullover or cardigan
- Plain pale blue polo shirt and simple blue shorts for PE (currently not required and changes will be communicated)
- Grey socks or tights
- Black gym shoes for indoors
- Simple hair accessories

First Holy Communion



As a strong faith community, we were very disappointed for last year's Primary 4 children who were unable to receive the Blessed Sacrament for the first time on the days that they should have celebrated their First Holy Communion.

Fr Byrne and I have had extensive discussions about the best way forward so that the children can make the Sacrament. Together, we feel that, with on-going restrictions around numbers in Church and the extensive social distancing that is still in place, that postponing the celebrations until next May/June 2021 would be the best course of action. This means that both P4 and P5 would make the Sacrament together in May/June 2021. If you feel that you would like to discuss your child making the Sacrament earlier than this, please let myself or Fr Bryne know as soon as possible.
