

How is my child assessed?

Last session's questionnaire for parents and carers highlighted that some parents and carers would like more information how their child/ren is/are assessed. A summary is provided here.

Why do we assess?

- To give St Brigid's children meaningful opportunities to demonstrate what they know, understand and can do across the curriculum
- ♦ To help St Brigid's children know the standards to aim for, and to understand what they need to do next to improve their work
- ♦ To provide quality evidence for St Brigid's teachers about each learner's achievements, strengths and next steps and clear information to parents and carers which enables them to support their child's learning

What do we assess?

- · Knowledge and Understanding
- Skills
- Attitudes and Capabilities

How do we assess?

We undertake two main, but complementary, types of assessment in St Brigid's: assessment for learning (formative assessment) and assessment of learning (summative assessment).

We also look at holistic assessment which is assessment of whole-work activities rather than individual skills or pieces of knowledge; similar to how we apply what we know and what we can do in real world settings.

When do we assess?

Children are continually assessed to ensure that programmes of work are appropriate to their level thereby meeting their needs and also to inform next steps.

Computer Games & Online Gaming

I continue to be concerned about children gaming online in real time with other children outwith school time. A number of children have reported to me that the language that they are being exposed to online as they play computer games with peers, is choice at best and wholly inappropriate at worst.

I have highlighted this with individual parents but I also would like to highlight this to all parents and carers so that you can discuss with your child any concerns that they have. Many of the games which are being played are also not appropriate for primary school children. Let's do all we can to keep our children sefe.

Appropriate PE wear
