

W elcome to 2016 and the beginning of a new term. You will be aware that across Glasgow City Council there was no access to information technology in the run up to the Christmas holiday. We ended last term with two wonderful performances of the Nativity play and Christmas concert. We are always pleased to have guests and we were particularly grateful to the elected members who came along: Nicola Sturgeon, First Minister and MSP for Glasgow Southside; Alison Thewliss MP and Baillie Jim Scanlon. The choir performed a host of Christmas favourites at Glasgow Community Safety Building bringing festive cheer to staff. Thank you to Community Safety staff for the gifts for the children and donation to School Fund. Our P7 and P6 children who took part in the Mock Court Case project made fantastic cases for the prosecution and defence and gave excellent witness statements over two nights in Glasgow High Court. The P6 pursuer team were given the Sheriff's verdict on the night. However, the work of the court reporters and court illustrators now has to be submitted before a final winner is announced.

P3 children have continued to play in the infant playground. We are now half way through the school year and the children are ready to make the transition to the main playground. Tomorrow and Friday of this week they will play in the infant yard in the morning and the main yard at lunch time. With effect from Monday 11 January, P3 children will use the main playground during both morning intervals and lunch breaks.

Ms Graham left St Brigid's at the end of last term to return to Perth for family reasons. A new teacher has been appointed to teach Primary 3 and I am awaiting confirmation of her start date. What do we want to do?

To develop further progression and attainment in mathematics

How are we doing this?

Our teachers have engaged in professional discussion around achievement in numeracy with teachers at the same stage in our learning community trio (St Brigid's, St Fillan's and St Francis' primaries). This allowed teachers to moderate progression and achievement across the three schools.

There will be a further opportunity in February for teachers to engage in discussion with our partner schools when the focus will be mathematical problem solving.

The headteachers and P7 teachers of our learning community trio will meet with Holyrood Secondary maths staff in January to discuss progression in learning.

Class visits next term will focus on mathematics. All teachers will be involved in a class visit with either peers from our partner schools (P1, P4 & P7), with a partner headteacher or with Mrs Scott or Mr Cassidy. Good practice from the visits will be shared.

Children at P1, P4 and P7 stages will be assessed to confirm teachers' judgements of their progress.

Headteacher partners from our learning community trio and our local improvement group quad (St Brigid's, St Francis, Battlefield and Shawlands) will moderate achievement in mathematics across the schools and share best practice.

Information from our own school and looking outwards to good practice elsewhere will inform our improvement priorities for next session.
