### From the Head Teacher's desk

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e are delighted to welcome back all of our children and staff on the 15th of March 2021.

It has been an extremely difficult few months and I hope that this full time return heralds the beginning of getting back to normality. A few weeks ago our P1-P3 children returned and I wish to thank everyone for ensuring that our school reopened in a safe manner. The school has been so calm and P1-P3 children have settled in very well. I continue to be thrilled with the result of our combined efforts and everyone should be very proud of how smoothly we have opened the school in these challenging circumstances.

We need to continue to work hard in the next phase of school reopening to follow the guidance so we can live our lives as we did prior to the lockdown in March 2020. I wish to take this opportunity to thank every one of our children, our families and school staff for their support with children's learning online and the determination shown in ensuring that we made the best of a very difficult time for us all. You have truly worked miracles!

In this newsletter, you will be reminded of the information on the practical arrangements which you need to know about as we welcome our P4-P7 children back. Please look out for any new information too. As in August 2020, we have assessed risk in line with council policy and have put systems and procedures in place which take activities already assessed as low risk and minimise this risk even further. Hand washing will continue to be facilitated throughout the day by teaching and support staff. In addition, resuming staggered breaks will ensure that everyone comes into minimal contact with others who are not in their class. All children should wear their uniforms on the days that they do not have P.E. There is a reminder of the days overleaf.

With current restrictions, there will be no face to face Parent's Evening this term. As there has been a lot of contact between parents and teachers I feel that a further consultation before the Easter break is not necessary for everyone. ### **Entering the School Building/Playground**

Can I remind parents and carers that they are **not permitted to come into the playground** and that each child should be accompanied by 1 parent/carer. Your child should enter the playground from the allocated gate no earlier than 8:50am and there will be a member of the management team in each playground. Once your child has entered the playground, **we ask that you make your way home in order to minimise the number of parents/carers gathering at the gates.** The gate across the playground will be locked and so is no longer available as a short cut from Newhouse Rd to Glenmore Ave or vice versa. The gate will be opened for a few minutes in the morning and afternoon to allow P5 & P6a access to and from the main entrance.

### High Expectations— School Uniform

The children all look very smart in their uniforms. Please continue to support our full uniform policy as this helps children to feel included and to be proud of their school.

# What to bring to school.....



Children should bring a school bag with their water bottle and lunch if applicable. Please make sure they are full as we are not currently using the water coolers. If your child drinks a lot of water, then please consider putting two bottles in their bags. There is also water available at lunch time.

### Toys from home are not permitted in school for the foreseeable future.

All children will receive their own set of resources please do not send your child to school with pencil cases or any stationery from home. Thank you for understanding.

### **Mobile Phones**



To keep all children safe, children may not have phones with them in class, around the school or in the playground.

As we cannot guarantee phones will be safe and Glasgow City Council has no insurance for personal items, mobile phones **should not** be brought to school. I am happy to discuss this on the phone.

# **Breakfast Club / Lunch (Dining Hall) arrangements**



Breakfast club will run from 8:00am to 9:00am.

Children who are entitled to a free school meal will use the dining hall. Children who have a packed lunch will continue to eat their lunch in class or outside if the weather is good.

Some free school lunches may be delivered to classrooms in order to ease the amount of pressure on the serving times in the dining hall. We do not want to rush children to finish their lunch. Please note that as with all aspects of our return to school, this and other arrangements are subject to change. Any changes will be communicated to parents/carers.


### **Social Distancing**



There remains no requirement for children to socially distance from each other. Indoors, the children will continue to be maintained in their classes throughout the day wherever possible. Children will, however, mix out with their classes in the playground.
