Entering the School Building/Playground

Just a reminder that for the safety of all children, adults are only permitted to enter the school building via the main door at the school office. Please report to the office and a member of staff will assist you. Also both playgrounds are not supervised until 8:50am by a member of SLT.

School Improvement Priorities



From recent survey results shared by Glasgow City Council, it was highlighted that parents/carers would like further information on how schools use assessment throughout the year.

This year, our teaching staff have been engaging in professional learning focused on Assessment, as part of Glasgow's city-wide approach to highly effective learning and teaching. This training supports our commitment to helping all learners achieve high-quality outcomes through consistent, research-informed classroom practice.

Throughout the training, staff have taken part in professional dialogue with colleagues, reflecting on key research and ideas around assessing pupils' learning. They have explored the purpose of assessment, including the principles behind ongoing (formative), periodic, standardised, and high-quality (holistic) assessment.

As part of this work, teachers have been developing their confidence in:

- Reflecting on evidence-based strategies to improve learning and teaching practice;
- Embedding aspects of highly effective pedagogy into daily routines to ensure positive, measurable outcomes for pupils.
- Leading and contributing to meaningful discussions that support practical approaches to embedding the learning, teaching and assessment cycle.

We are proud of the professional growth our staff continue to demonstrate, and we look forward to seeing the continued impact on learners' experiences in the classroom. We will continue to keep you updated and ensure you are part of our improvement journey.


