From the Head Teacher's desk

s always August and September are busy months where we settle back into school life and finalise our priorities as we continue on our journey of improvement. This has been very challenging for all of us, however, I am immensely proud of our children, staff and school community for their resilience as we continue to improve our core business of children's learning while maintaining a safe environment.

This year our four priorities are to:

Engage with the Scottish Government's strategic framework for the reopening of schools by implementing

Glasgow City Council's procedures and policies which focus on recovery, resilience and reconnection.

Continue to raise attainment in literacy, numeracy & health and wellbeing maintaining a consistent approach to teaching and learning and ensuring our assessments of children's learning supports teachers to identify gaps and then planning for plugging those gaps.

Engage in regular moderation activities to ensure that assessment is integral to the planning of learning and teaching and to agree standards and expectations within our school and with St Conval's Primary.

Continue to work in partnership with St Brigid's Parish by organising our annual calendar of events and planned opportunities for Fr Bryne to support us in meeting the pastoral needs of our school community ensuring the spiritual wellbeing of children is met throughout this time of restrictions and social distancing.

We are looking forward to overtaking these priorities and continuing to improve the work of our school. With this newsletter, I am sending out a copy of our Standards and Quality Report which summarises and highlights all of last year's achievements. This is also available on our website.

School staff value greatly the relationship between home and school and the important role played by parents and carers in their children's learning. REMINDER Entering the school building/Playground



Can I remind parents and carers that they are **not permitted to come into the playground** and that each child should be accompanied by 1 parent/carer only.

Your child should enter the playground from the allocated gate no earlier than 8:50am and there will be a member of the management team in each playground. Once your child has entered the playground, we ask that you make your way home in order to minimise the number of parents/carers gathering at the gates.

Please note that the gate across the playground will be locked and so is no longer available as a short cut from Newhouse Rd to Glenmore Ave or vice versa. The gate will be opened for a few minutes in the morning and afternoon to allow P5 & P6a access to and from the main entrance.

In recent months, we have had a few reports about children participating in on-line activity which made them feel unsafe. Please discuss with your child about appropriate use of phones/devices and the content they are posting/viewing on social media.

Please be aware of any group chats your child/ren may be part of and ensure they understand any content that is shared or accessed. Please remind children that once something is posted and even if it is deleted others may have a screenshot or have saved the post.
